## **Car sharing - AD**

Driving an average UK car at 36 miles per gallon for 1 mile emits 530g of  $CO_2e$ . Did you know that you could cut that emission by 50-80% by giving a lift to others (who were going to drive by themselves instead)?

The Environment Group have decided to set up a new Car-Sharing Scheme so that anyone who is unable to walk or cycle to church has the opportunity to share lifts with others and lower their carbon footprint. ## **Open Hands Reigate - LA**

Under the Christ Church umbrella, a food bank collection point was set up in June 2020 during lockdown to support those in our local area. This was originally done via Renewed Hope Trust, and then passing to Open Hands Reigate, which resides in Reigate Baptist Church. Not only was our initial aim to provide needed food for those struggling in lockdown, but it was also bringing our Nutfield community together in uncertain times.

Early one morning, in late summer, when collecting the donations, we found freshly picked apples in our collection box. Then courgettes, parsley, onions, spinach, marrows kale, beetroot, squashes would be found too. It was a joy to find such goodies in our collection basket and share this with the volunteers at Open Hands, who were genuinely thrilled, and then to pass these donations to our thankful families.

Many of the fresh products are donated during the height of the growing season, when there is an abundance of homegrown food, and this is where our food bank opens its arms to you. So, if you have a glut of food growing in your garden, or on your allotment, and it needs a home, then please do consider donating.

I would like to add that the volunteers are always amazed by the amount of donations taken into the food bank, each Tuesday morning. Open Hands had many collection points around the Redhill/Regiate area during lockdown but our little one in South Nutfield still shines brightly. Let's keep it shining. Thank YOU!

#### Reverend Helen Burnett's Environment Talk - VH

A group of us got together with Reverend Len and Reverend Helen Burnett to listen to her interactive talk on our Christian response to the climate crisis, here in Surrey.

Helen started with a meditation, each of us holding a Scottish pebble, considering the deep time it represents about the planet earth, and God's time and Creation being held in His hands.

We were encouraged to consider when we first realised that there was a problem with the climate, what stopped us in our tracks? Now, currently

where do we find our hope? And finally, where are we aiming for next in combatting climate change, as individuals and as a community?

She mentioned various ways of engaging with the local community that they have used in Chaldon and Caterham:

- The Big Green Day (in the Big Green Week at the end of June)
- The pilgrimage of Bishop Martin of Kingston during Lent, the possibility of hosting an evening meal, sleep over and breakfast for the pilgrims next Lent, if we are not all able to walk
- Engaging with the school's Eco Group to support the teachers and children
- Using vigil in public spaces, to hold a space in prayer, perhaps


where there are environmental threats, such as contaminated water.

She used prayers and a poem to finish, challenging us to consider what are we going to do with the rest of our life?

The participants made generous donations, so we raised over

£100 to go towards climate friendly improvements to the Church Hall.

# Book Review - How Can I Help Hedgehogs? - CF (Helen Bostock and Sophie Collins)



With a foreword by Isabella Tree of Knepp Rewilding, this charming book caught my attention recently. It is intended to help existing gardeners wishing to make their gardens more beneficial to wildlife without drastic modification. The writing style is friendly and helpful, presenting a series of questions and answers or solutions that are easy to follow.

#### **Church Maintenance Day**




A stitch in time saves nine ©
